CSAT's Day of Tolerance was held on 4/21/23 and was a student-led celebration to acknowledge everyone in the LGBTQ+ community and help others have experiences within our group. In our GSA it has always been preached that discussions are important, but the only way to help others understand and breed true tolerance is to give the students in our school the chance to have experiences with us. The Day of Tolerance was that opportunity to share experiences with our GSA.

In the morning our high school GSA travelled to the middle school and met with their GSA. Combined we had nearly 40 students. We did an arts and crafts pin making activity followed by a team-building activity and gave our students the opportunity to learn about each others' experiences and what to expect when they attend our high school.



We finished our day by using the money that was awarded to us to give each student the chances to express themselves outwardly giving each student pride merchandise like a flag that represents their identity, pins, vinyl stickers, and of course...Skittles. (This was the biggest hit of all because apparently our middle school GSA refers to themselves as "The Skittle Club". You get it.)

Students also received information about contacts in the area and where to find support for wellness including the PFLAG organization.

After leaving the middle school and getting ice cream at 10:30 in the morning, we returned to the high school where we set up a booth for students to collect information about our club, learn about the LGBTQ+ community, and also receive some of the same pride merchandise we gave away at the middle school.



The event turned into an extremely tolerant and exciting coming out party of sorts. It was endearing to see the open arms waiting for students as they bravely put themselves out there and allowed each other to celebrate and recognize their differences.
